### Principal's report - Matt Gagnier

#### School Startup

- Welcoming back almost 1200 students (including ~200 new SRB students) brings excitement
  and energy to the beginning of the school year. We are focusing on building positive
  relationships and routines at the beginning of the year to support student learning and wellbeing.
- This summer our school care staff helped support Summer School, as well as managed construction projects; a huge thank you to the team to get our school ready to open. Thanks to our Main office staff for also making sure we were ready to start the year.
- We have a number of new staff this year across intermediate panels, secondary panels, as well in the main office. Joining the office team is Janet Marchington who is part time in guidance and part time in the main office.
- We have a school administration team of 4 people myself, John Ioannou with responsibilities for grade 7-8, Karl Carey, Grade 9-12 A-K, and Christine Rankin Grade 9-12 L-Z.

- Staff participated in the PA Day on September 1 ahead of school start: the focus was student well-being, school safety, violence prevention and literacy.
- We hosted opening assemblies for all grades in the first days of school; our theme this year, is Be Kind, Engaged and Responsible. We will be revisiting this throughout the year as needed.

#### Intermediate Panel

- We welcomed 366 intermediate students to our school.
- Smooth start for students and staff, the first day was a mix of introductory activities, getting assigned lockers, and orienting themselves with their learning spaces and new teachers.
- We are learning about our students and reviewing Ontario Student Records, and Individual Education Plans. Every year our Learning Support Teacher, Val Steed, reaches out to solicit parent input into the Individual Education Plan, our Learning Resource Teacher, Brenda Highmore, will be meeting with students and supporting their classrooms. We have two Educational Assistant Nasteho Mohamed and Amy-Lynn Vandusen.
- Please reach out if you feel your child needs additional support please contact your child's homeroom teacher as a starting point.
- We have hired a few new teachers this year: Crystal Lyle (French Immersion), Anthony Marchildon-White (French Immersion), Rupinder Kaur (Regular English Program), Bella Lewkowicz (French Immersion), and Niles Matson (Core French Teacher grade 7)
- We are continuing to review our class sizes and we will be making adjustments as required by the school board, we will inform parents if there are any changes that are being made per School board timelines. This is part of the normal process to confirm projected enrolment to actual enrolment for the end of September. We are down ~30 students from the projected enrollment due to students moving away, attending other schools, etc.
- Students have enjoyed being allowed to choose their destination (Cafeteria, Loft, Gym, or Yard) during the two break times this was a change based on staff and student requests for more flexibility during the recess time.
- Students should look forward to upcoming sporting and club opportunities, in addition to the morning announcements, we will have the TV in the circle presenting information.
- Terry Fox Run Event will take place Thursday, October 5th, students are raising money to support the Terry Fox Foundation for Cancer Research.

#### **Secondary Panel**

- We welcomed ~771 students in Grade 9-12.
- Grade assemblies took place in week 1 to orient students to the 2023-2024 school year.
- Various clubs already running this semester: updates are on the SRB school website.
- Various sports teams are currently in a selections process for the Fall season; Varsity girls basketball, golf, junior boys soccer, rugby 7s: Instagram account (@SRBAthletics).
- Homecoming dance October 13, 2023.
- We have hired a few new teachers this semester; Greg Hicks (Head of English, Technology and the Arts), Fertuna O Berhane (junior science), Michael Quigg (junior and senior mathematics), Michelle Oko (Core and Immersion French), Patrick Lawlor (Integrated Technology).

- Guidance is busy adjusting senior student timetables to match pathways. If your child requires support with pathway planning, career advice or social-emotional support please have them contact their Guidance counsellor.
- We continue to encourage our students to arrive early for classes so that they are in class and ready to learn at 9:00 am and 12:30 pm after the lunch hour.

- Our Grade 7-12 Open House / Grade 7-8 Meet the teacher event is this Thursday, September 21st, 2023, 4:30-6:00. Student Council is hosting a BBQ beginning after 5:00pm. We hope all families can join us to visit our learning spaces, school facilities, and informally hear about the student experience/program. Please bring your child with you so they can show you where you need to be!
- Chartwells is a 3rd party operator that will be getting our School Caferteria back up and running it should open this coming Monday. We will make announcements to students.
- We encourage your child to get involved in school clubs, sports, and pro-social activities and of course ensure they are meeting their class/course requirements. Our staff are here to support your child in their learning. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teachers.
- School Council Financial Update We have \$1300 in the main School Council account, and \$678 in the Parent Involvement Funding Account as we open the school year.
