- Make contact with university/college/liaison officers
- Keep up-to-date with changes
- Talk to your counsellor

## TERMINOLOGY

- **OSSD**– Ont. Sec. School Diploma
- **Undergraduate program** - first university program
- **Bachelor's degree** - first degree in university/ sometimes college
- **Diploma** - obtained after completion of college program

## Why College?

- **89% of college grads find jobs within 6 months of graduation**
- **1/3 of Ontario's workforce is made up of college grads**
- **University grads apply to college for job-ready skills**
- **Practical experience & small class size**
- **Lower tuition costs**
- **Shorter program length=working sooner**

## Considerations

- **Kinesthetic learner** - practical applications
- **Hard skills** - job ready
- **Transition** - university
- **Some college programs not available at university (Dental Hygiene, Veterinary Technician)**
- **Articulation** - agreements to transfer to specific university programs

- **Ontario College Handbook - Chart of all programs and all colleges in Ontario**
- **OCAS - Ontario College Application Service (located in Guelph, Ontario)**
- **OEN (Ontario Education Number)**

## Important Dates

- **Apply - beginning October 2011**
- **February 1<sup>st</sup> - Equal consideration date**
- **Offers - begin February 1, 2012**
- **Accept offers - February - May, 2012**
- **June 15, 2012 - earliest date to pay tuition**

## College Application Process

- **Application is on-line**
- **Tutorial - available on the web site**
- **No PIN number required**
- **Cost - \$95 for 5 choices**
- **Maximum 3 choices at one college**
- **Pay - on-line (credit card), cheque (mail)**

## Apply

**APPLY TO COLLEGE**  
Go to ontariocolleges.ca click on "Apply". Select the option that applies to you to continue.

**EXISTING USER**  
Account created between September 26, 2009 and May 17, 2011 for the 2010-2011 or 2011-2012 application cycle(s).

All applicants that have created an online application before May 17, 2011 need to complete the required information to allow us to retrieve your account information. If an exact match is found an account activation email with complete instructions will be sent to the email address provided during account creation.

**Let's Get Started**

- If you have **NOT** created an account with ontariocolleges.ca
- If you created an account for the 2010-11 or 2011-12 application cycle, between Sept. 26, 2009 and May 17, 2011.
- If you have **already migrated** your account OR created an account after May 24, 2011.

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Complete the information in this section. Take note of your username and password. Click "I Agree to the Terms and Conditions" to continue to the next step.

- By default, your user name will be your email address. Deselect the checkbox to enter a username of your choice.
- Make sure your password is a minimum 8 characters, has upper and lower case letters, and at least one number and one symbol - !@#\$%^&\*.
- Challenge questions are used to verify your identity if you need to call our customer contact centre.
- If you do not agree to the Terms and Conditions you will be logged out of the secure online college application.

An email will be sent to the email address provided during account creation. Click on the link within the email to activate your account.  
**Note: You will not be able to log in without activating your account.**

Click on the link to access the log in screen.

Log in using the username and password created when signing up for an account. If you forget your username and/or password click on the link to have your information sent to the email address provided during account creation.

You may also log into your account by going to ontariocolleges.ca and clicking on **APPLY** and selecting the "Returning / Migrated User" Sign In button.

## Timelines for College Applications

- **Feb. 1<sup>st</sup>** - deadline for online application
- **Feb. 1<sup>st</sup>** - earliest release of offers by colleges (apply early!)
- **May 1<sup>st</sup>** - offer must be confirmed

## Marks

- Colleges receive final grades from **9-12**
- Grade 12 - semester 1 **midterm marks (November)** are sent

## Applied Degrees Collaborative Degrees

- **Applied Degrees in College**
  - Bachelor of Applied Design (Interior Design)
  - Bachelor of Applied Business (e-Business)
  - Bachelor of Hospitality & Tourism Management
- **Collaborative Degrees- partnerships between college and university**
  - Bachelor of Science in Nursing with U of Ottawa
  - Bachelor of Information Technology with Carleton University
- **Articulation agreements with universities**

## Collaborative Degree Bachelor of Science in Nursing

- **Degree program** – university courses required for application
- **Courses** at both Algonquin College and University of Ottawa
- Apply on **OUAC** not OCAS
- **Competitive programs** – apply at both university and college

## Articulation Sample Scenario

- **Business Administration**
- Algonquin College (3 yr. diploma)
- Enter year 3 of B.Comm at U of Ottawa
- diploma + degree
- practical training
- **Tuition** - college           \$2,980
- - university       \$6,045

## Highly Competitive Programs

- **Apply early**
- May require further academic testing
- **Prerequisites** are important in ranking students
- Check list on the college web site

## University Application

- a PIN (Personal Identification Number)
- a school number
- a student number



Pin numbers arrive in late November

## Verify....verify....verify

- Log on to the OUAC or OCAS websites and **VERIFY** the following:
- Personal information
- Course history
- Current courses for both semesters
- Inform your counsellor about external credits being taken
  - Eg. night school, on-line courses etc.

## Important Information

- Make sure your **e-mail address** is up-to-date
- Make sure e-mail messages from OUAC or OCAS do not go to your junk mail
- Keep all your application information in a separate file

## University Timelines

- January 11** deadline to complete online application
  - February 7** recommended last date for university/program changes
  - May 29** latest date students can expect a response from an Ontario university
  - June 1** earliest date Ontario universities may require a response from students
- Universities **outside of Ontario** will have their own timelines and application process. eg. McGill

## Payment information

- Cost is **\$125** for 3 choices (non refundable)
- Additional choices are **\$42** each
- Can pay online using:
  - **Visa, Mastercard or American Express**
  - **Telephone banking**
  - **Cheque or money order**

## Marks

When you apply, grade 11 marks and completed grade 12 course marks are sent plus a list of courses you are taking this year

- 1<sup>st</sup> semester final marks
- 2<sup>nd</sup> semester midterm marks
- 2<sup>nd</sup> semester final marks

## Additional Admission Criteria

Programs that require *more than marks*

Examples- tests, portfolios, interviews, auditions and personal information forms

Be aware of **deadlines**

## UNIVERSITIES OUTSIDE OF ONTARIO

Bishop's, Concordia, McGill, Dalhousie, Simon Fraser, UBC, UVIC, U of Calgary are connected to OUAC

Most American Universities require testing ie. SAT

Contact university for specific instructions*

## What Happens Next?

- Read 'Welcome letter'
- Institutions will assign each applicant a **student number**
- Use this **student number** to track the status of your application

## University Offers

- Each university is different
- Early offers are made using grade 11 marks
- Most offers arrive after the mid-term of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester
- One offer does not cancel other offers
- Programs requiring portfolios, etc will have later offers

## University of Ottawa offer process

### First Round Offers (mid December)

- A minimum of 5 grade 11 (3U/M) grades must be available
- Average must be 80% or better (depends on program)
- No refusals at this time
- Applicants who do not receive an offer at this time will be evaluated in next round of offers

## Second Round Offers (March)

\*decisions are based on grade 12 and grade 11 marks

- A minimum of 3 grade 12 (4U/M) grades must be available
- All prerequisites must be presented (grades or in progress)
- A minimum of 6 courses are included in the calculation of average (eg. 4-4U/M and 3-3U/M)
- Places are kept open in all programs for the final round of offers

## Third Round Offers (May)

- Decisions based on grade 12 marks
- A minimum of 6 grade 12 (4U/M) grades must be available- final or interim grades
- All prerequisites must be presented
- Offers, refusals are sent

## Time to Apply

- Be Realistic
- Be Informed
- Don't Panic
- Remember, it's not a life-long decision
- Work hard, but enjoy this year!



# SCHOLARSHIPS

## SCHOLARSHIP TERMS

- **Scholarship**- money given to college or university bound students (usually based on marks, extra-curricular activities, community service, leadership or a combination of all)
- **Bursary**- money given to students based on financial need
- **Renewable**- money is given each year, if grade average is maintained
- **Non-Renewable**- money is given at one time only



## MORE TERMS.....

- **Sponsored Applicant**- student nominated by the school after being selected by the scholarship committee
- **Direct Application**- student is responsible for submitting the application to the institution by the deadline
- **Entrance Scholarships**- awarded automatically by colleges and universities to high school graduates

## EXAMPLES OF ACHIEVEMENTS

- Volunteering
- Awards: academic, music, art achievements, etc.
- Leadership positions - instructor's assistant, camp counsellor, etc.
- Sports, clubs or outdoor pursuits in school or the community
- Employment
- International Travel





## THE APPLICATION


### Step Three: Completing and Submitting The Application

- Read the scholarship instructions carefully (eg. word count, due dates, postage, signatures, etc.)
- Use a word processor to complete the application
- Edit your rough draft
- Meet the DEADLINES! Late applications will not be considered



## LETTER OF REFERENCE

- Ask someone who knows you really well (coach, teacher, former employer, or community contact)
- Ask two weeks ahead of time
- Provide your reference with a list of your achievements (resume)
- Write a thank you letter! It's important.

- Minimum academic average of 90%
- Entering University for the first time
- Original and creative thought
- Leadership potential
- Commitment to the community



**Application Requirements:**

- School Sponsorship Required (up to 4 candidates)
- Application Form; includes short essays
- Original Transcript

**DEADLINE:** February 14, 2012

#### Application Requirements:

- Application Form; Includes a short essay
- Original Transcript
- Letter of acceptance from post-secondary institution

- 80-84.9%.....\$4000 (\$1000 x 4 years)
