Bullying Prevention Plan:

School Safety Indicators:

The \$500 deposit has not occurred yet.

8. Secondary School Committee Update – Paula Shaver

The students are making the decisions. The principal prefers the War museum over the museum of Nature. The students chose the boat cruise for after party. Security was confirmed by J.R (checked by Gatineau police). No response about security on the boat. It will be an SRB only party.

No contract was signed as of January 13/2015

Results of a survey conducted on December 8, 2014 (inspired from AY Jackson) : 80 students over 220 responded.

94% for choose Diner and after prom

83% wanted it after June

54% wanted it downtown, 4% in the school

Preferences were: event to be formal, no parents attending, a unique location and a buffet

Discussion:

Sonia: can we make the students look into alternatives next year?

Date has to be in May but the problem is that the Catholic board already book everything in May.

Paula: How to get started on having a shift in the culture of the proms.

Wendy Verreault: The change has to come from the students. We need to talk to small groups of students. We need to inform the students of Grade 12 and as well those of Grade 11.
