Presentation of the board survey by Steve Jackson

There are four categories:

Social and emotional

Physical health

Drivers of student's outcomes

Observations

- By grade 12, 89% of students plan to go to university.
- 92% of students have a positive feeling about SRB.
- There is a positive student teacher relation, the same level as the board's average. It was noted that the students get a low very level of encouragement and advice from the teachers. This is a board level observation.
- Bullying is lower than Canadian average and decreases from grade 9 to grade 12.
- Students new to Canada and male students seem to feel more bullying and harassment than the average.

The board will release the survey findings.

7. Teaching Staff Report - Andrew Williams and Michael Blakely

There was participation over the last month in math contests

A team of six enthusiastic grade 11 students engaged with the Canadian Team Mathematics Contest from the University of Waterloo. This is a 3 hour contest and the students demonstrated great collaborative and mathematical skills

There was also participation in the Fermat, Galois and Hypatia contests this past month

This past Tuesday May 5, 14 students challenged the AP Calculus exam - they worked hard all morning and we are all very proud of their perseverance, hard work and achievement

Mr.Blakely, Ms. Zhao and Mr.Jackson travelled to Toronto to take part in the OAME Annual Conference (Ontario Association of Mathematics Educators). This was a 2.5 day conference and we learned a lot about mathematics education and its connections with collaborative inquiry, special education, student success, creativity and questioning, and assessment and evaluation

On May 26 we are hosting all of the Grade 8 students from Greenbank MS for a morning of Math Olympics! This event is being organized by our Math Department. Our Link Crew will welcome the students with an opening activity, after which students will participate in fun mathematical activity for most of the morning and then at 11:30 our Student Council will host a BBQ for them.

We are running Exam Challenge for students in Grade 9 again this year and it will be conducted by Ms. Suzane Thomas. This is a student success initiative to ensure that students do earn a credit and develop confidence with mathematics

We are also running our Grade 10/11 Quadratics Numeracy initiative again this year which is being conducted by Ms.Katherine Lee who is a new B.Ed. graduate from UOttawa and a former SRB graduate! This is another student success initiative through which we hope to develop confidence and student understanding in this very central content area of mathematics

Finally, math continues to be **awesome** and **very cool**.

8. Secondary School Committee Update – Paula Shaver

The next OCASC meeting will occur next week.

Current topics:

Schools need guidelines to make their websites consistent. Talks about the mental health initiative.

9. PRO Grant – Lyn Hall and Carolyn Matson

Carolyn circulated a flyer for the PRO Grant presentation next year:

Parenting Teens through Challenging Times (Depression, Anxiety, Bullying and Suicide)

The document contained details about the options, the schedule and the cost. Discussion about date availability: end of September and early October.

10. Financial Report – Wendy Verreault

The balance is \$ 1267.23

The council has received the 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 \$500 funds from the Ministry.

11. Discussion

Prom

Paula noted that we need parent volunteers.

Wendy reported that the current cost of the prom is \$170.

Next year, staff will assist with the prom organization and the event will take place in Ontario, in May, with no after party. There were concerns that May is usually the month when the Catholic board organizes their proms too.

Other

Question raised about the strike impact on the students. The particular concern was about grade 9 EQEAO and summer school.
