6. Principal Report – Wendy Verreault

There are changes to the French Curriculum within OCDSB: no more extended classes. September 2016: All JK/SK will be receiving 50/50 French/English education.

DELF exam is planned. Deadline for registration is January 13.

Answer (Principal): That was a change initiated by the ministry. Exams are scheduled from Tuesday to Friday. In case of snow day during that period, exams will be held on the next Monday. In that case, the start of the second semester will be on Wednesday February 3rd instead of Tuesday.

Current news

- The Music Jazz Evening and Christmas Concert were very entertaining and well attended by students and families. A Euphonium was purchased with the proceeds.
- The Mystery Dinner Theatre was directed by two grade 12 students and they did an exceptionally good job.
- The Multicultural Show showcased over 25 difference performances by students. We have some very talented students. Part of the proceeds was donated to the Education Foundation.
